FYI,

Were starting to receive calls from Missouri based motor carriers with questions regarding the upcoming UCR renewal. Carolyn Lyon a North Central Missouri based carrier faxed the attached copy of the news letter MODOT recently sent to their motor carriers informing them they would not be participating in the UCR for 2007. Her concern is that she would have to make the long drive to Topeka, a considerable expense to her, to renew her company. She does not have the ability to renew on-line, I told her I would talk to our MODOT counterpart and see what their plans were.

I discussed this issue with Barbra Hague, MODOT, they are considering working walk-ins if they are able to pay with credit card or electronic check by using the national program or one of the surrounding states programs. However, they can't accept walk-ins with a cash payment, Barbra did say that their office would handle the initial mailing of applications they just haven't received confirmation about working the walk-in's etc.

I contacted Mrs. Lyon and advised her of her options, I told her if Missouri decides not to provide services to any of their customers she can simply mail or fax in her application along with the E-Check or Credit Card information and we or any participating state could process her application.

I plan to bring this issue up at the Chicago Board meeting on Monday, we need to get the non-participating states to help as much as possible by signing a MOU outlining what services they plan to do etc. This will help us and other states determine workload issues etc. for the upcoming renewal.

MoDOT Unable to Participate in 2007 UCR Rollout

The 2007 Missouri Legislature adjourned May 18 without passing a bill that would have allowed the state to participate in the Unified Carrier Registration program.

"We're very disappointed," said Jan Skouby, MoDOT Motor Carrier Services director, "Because the law did not pass, our office cannot register carriers into the federally required UCR program should the board begin enrollment in 2007."

Outlined in the 2005 SAFETEA-LU Act, The UCR replaces the Single State Registration System.

It is expected to begin in late 2007 in states that have adopted the program as law. MoDOT MCS hopes to provide carriers a list of participating states and registration instructions when the program begins.

"MoDOT will petition the UCR board for inclusion in 2008," said Skouby. "We'll also ask next year's legislature to authorize Missouri to become a UCR state. Until then, we'll do what we can to help our motor carrier customers register for the program elsewhere."

MCS is Disappointed, Cannot Participate in 2007 UCR

Among the proposals in the transportation omnibus bill this legislative season was one that would have allowed Missouri to participate in Unified Carrier Registration. It's a federally required program that requires all interstate motor carriers to register and pay fees. Carriers who don't participate are fined.

Because the bill did not pass this year, carriers who base their businesses in Missouri will have to go to another state to file for UCR. The other state gets to keep the fee, so Missouri will lose an estimated \$2.3 million in safety funds for 2007.

We at MoDOT Motor Carrier Services are concerned about the lost funds, but we're most upset that our customers will be inconvenienced.

We have no real recourse for 2007, but will petition for inclusion in the 2008 season with the UCR board. We'll also

work to get the proposal back in front of legislators so we have a chance to take part in the registration process in late 2008.

MCS will provide a list of participating states to Missouri carriers. When UCR begins, we hope to provide the forms and information you'll need to register in the other states.

We've worked very hard to build strong relationships with our customers and are profoundly disappointed that this is the best we can do.

Figuring out whether a business needs a USDOT Number or Operating Authority and understanding the registration process is about to get a whole lot easier.



Fuel Receipts

Check fuel receipts and make certain the date and time, fuel type and number of gallons is correct.

IFTA auditors look for this information. If it is missing or incorrect, you'll be asked to provide proof of accuracy and could be fined.
